The workshop will focus on better understanding individual donors in the new age of digital strategies, along with new forms of philanthropy. Participants will learn how to think like donors and how to apply communication tools for donor engagement, retention, and renewal.

Facilitator: Megan Kashner, CSW, MBA is a seasoned leader with more than 20 years of strategic management, community partnership building, and organizational planning experience across the nonprofit sector, Megan is a Clinical Assistant Professor and Director of Social Impact for the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University. She is also the founder of Benevolent—a platform using bleeding-edge technology and leveraging donor proclivities to fill gaps in the safety net for low-income families.

Now in its thirteenth year in Evanston, the root2fruit initiative is funded by the Mammel Foundation and includes a combination of grants renewable for three years and mentorship for grantees. Read the [guidelines](#) or begin the process with our online [eGrant application](#). Selected organizations will be notified in early December. Grants are distributed on a calendar year basis.
