The root2fruit program is designed to build the capacity of small to mid-size nonprofits in Evanston. Now in its twelfth year in Evanston, the root2fruit initiative is funded by the Mammel Foundation and includes a combination of grants renewable for three years and mentorship for grantees. Read the [guidelines](#) or begin the process with our online [eGrant application](#). Selected organizations will be notified in early December. Grants are distributed on a calendar year basis.

Alumni grant applications are also due at 11:59PM on Monday, October 12th. These grants are for use by December 31, 2016, and are meant to allow root2fruit alums to focus on one aspect of sustainability, such as resource development, technology or board development.
